Rabbi Menachem Froman, born in the Galilee, is an Ashkenazi Orthodox rabbi, peacemaker and negotiator, with close ties to Palestinian religious leaders from the PLO and Hamas. Sheikh Ghassan Manasra, is the director of the Islamic Cultural Center in Nazareth, which promotes tolerance and interfaith dialogue. He also directs, Anwar il-Salaam, a Muslim peace and dialogue center. Both leaders have dedicated their lives to understanding the relationship between religion and peacemaking.
